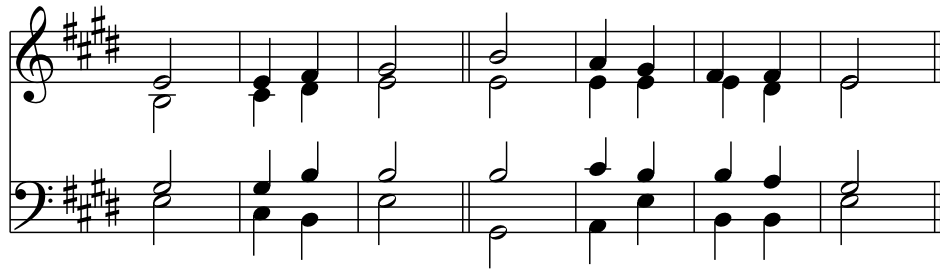


Psalm 70 — *Deus, in adjutorium*
