

- 4 1 Sing with joy to / God our / strength and raise a loud / shout to the / God of / Jacob.
 - 2 Raise a song and / sound the / timbrel, the / mer-ry / harp, and the / lyre.
- M 3 Blow the ram's-horn at the / nëw / moon, and at the / full moon, the / day of our / feast.
- W 4 For this is a / statute for / Israel, a / law of the / God of / Jacob.
- 5 He laid it as a solemn / charge up- on / Joseph, when he came / out of the / land of / Egypt.
 - 6 I heard an unfamiliar / voice / saying
 "I eased his shoulder from the burden; || his hands were set / free from / bearing the / load."
- 7 You called on me in / trouble, and I / saved you;

- M 11 And yet my people / did not hear my / voice, and / Israel would / not o- / bey me.
- W 12 So I gave them over to the / stubbornness of their / hearts,to / follow their / own de- / vices.
- W 13 Oh, that my people would / listen to / me! that / Israel would / walk in my / ways!
- M 14 I should soon sub- / due their / enemies and turn my / hand a- / gainst their / foes.
- 4 15 Those who hate the LORD would / cringe be- / fore him, and their / punishment would / last for / ever.



- 16 But Israel would I feed with the / fin-est / wheat and satisfy him with / hon-ey / from the / rock.
- Glory to the Father, and / to the / Son, and / to the / Ho-ly / Spirit:
