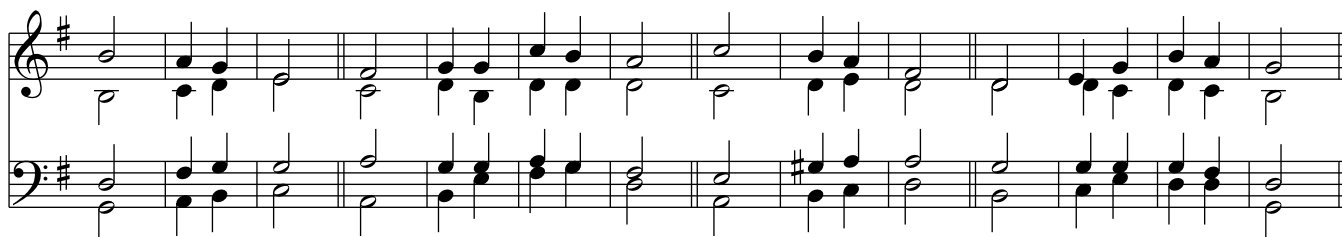




- 4      1 Lord, you have / been our / refuge
